# Meet the participants




This is her third summer at Adamant where she has been in the masterclasses of Christopher Elton and John O'Conor. Karen says that Adamant provides an ideal setting for her musical growth, a place where she can search for answers about her piano performance. She finds the interchange with young pianists on the cusp of their careers very invigorating, while at the same time, she can immerse herself in piano in an idyllic space without distraction.

**I** do Shalom made a 26-hour trip from Israel to Vermont to participate in the John O'Conor masterclass. Selftaught as a youth, he went on to study technique with Ina Matinsky during his teen years. Now he has finished his B.A at the Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance, studying with Dr. Ron Regev. He will begin his master's degree at the Shenandoah Conservatory this fall, where he will study with John O'Conor.

This summer was his first at Adamant. He was delighted with the the facilities—beautiful grand pianos in forest studios, private rooms for each participant, and a friendly intergenerational supportive community. He commented on the masterclass experience saying that although John O'Conor teaches



each student differently, everyone benefited from John's knowledge of all genres. One word sums it up: amazing!



Yanjue Lin was born in the Fujian Province of China. She has obtained degrees from Nanjing University of the Arts in China and the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. She will complete her DMA degree at Shenandoah Conservatory with Alexander Bernstein and Marika Bournaki.

While living in China, she was a journalist for three years on the staff of Ganlan Classic Music, a large platform numbering more than 500,000 members.



# The Summer of 467...



Editor's note: Michael Preddy continues his reminiscence of Edwine Behre and Adamant Music School in the 1960-70's. He is both a classical and pop musician and his multi-faceted career includes a stint as band director with the Smothers Brothers. He returns to Adamant this summer as a performer in the Jeffrey Cohen and Lucie Robert masterclass.

Starting in 1967, I came to Adamant for five years in a row. During that time, I flew periodically to New York to study with Edwine Behre if I had a competition or special performance coming up. I still have all the letters she wrote telling me where I would stay, where I could eat, and how to get to the Port Authority from the airport. Who does this! It is all part of the legacy handed to us to carry on. In the early 1980s, I brought students of my own to Adamant and the letters I got from them reminded me of the feelings of inspiration I had for the school. They had inherited that spirit, that legacy, through their common love of piano music.

I return and it's 2022. I am now seventy-one years old, I look around and so many of the people who were part of my youth are gone. No more Frieda Rosenblatt with her constant encouragement and technical magic, no Emma Dressler and her smile with a touch of pathos, and most of all, no more Edwine Behre, who believed in me and considered me talented enough to take under her wing, at least for a while, as I gave it a go at classical piano.

My career had taken a turn toward the pop world and for the next few decades, I worked on the road while occasionally returning to New York to play in one of the Carnegie Recital Hall Concerts for Adamant. Now I return in 2022, I drive out of Montpelier toward Haggett Road which always seems too far, always seems like I missed. I turn right onto that gravel road and go and go and go until you finally turn that curve, look down slightly and low and behold, that magical kingdom opens and begins to shine again. A world where I am fulfilled, the things I love are the things other people love as well, where music and piano are the most meaningful pursuit in our lives, and we know that Adamant is so much more than a place to take piano, or a summer camp, or a college portfolio stuffer. Adamant IS the ultimate destination. It is a safe space where people, young and old, rich or poor of any nationality or ethnicity can come to live and study alongside others in pursuit of Edwine Behre's dream. A chance to become part of that legacy and the distinct honor to do what we can to carry it forward for those who follow.
