Participant Biographies

Jonathan Mei, 16, is a rising junior at Academic Magnet High School in Charleston, SC. A dedicated pianist, Jonathan is a multiple-time first prize winner at the South Carolina MTNA competitions and earned first prizes at the 2019 Steinway & Sons Junior Piano Competition as well as the 2025 Nashville International Piano Competition. During the year he is a student of Marina Lomazov.

Maxwell Fetters is an incoming junior at Lehigh Valley Charter High School for the Arts in Bethlehem, PA. He studies piano with Dr. Daniel Immel of Kutztown University.

Ashley Chua is a Singaporean pianist currently pursuing her Master's degree in Collaborative Piano at Texas Christian University. She is currently studying with Professors Michael Bukhman and Enrico Elisi, and enjoys the pursuit of both solo and collaborative piano music.

Elias Palomares is pursuing his bachelor's degree at the Escuela Superior de Música in Monterrey, Mexico and is studying with Andrius Zlabys in the Traditional Session.

Jack Vreeland began performing Top 40 repertoire in bands throughout high school and college before discovering a passion for classical music at the University of Iowa, where he earned a degree in composition. Over the past 40 years, he has been largely self-taught and embraced the challenge of learning to sight-read at age 65.

Ruoyu Ni is a third-year undergraduate student at the Eastman School of Music, studying under Professor Marina Lomazov. She has earned multiple awards in international piano competitions and received Third Prize as a chamber musician in the France International Music Competition. Ruoyu has also performed recitals across China, the United States, and Italy

Qiaochuhan Li began her piano studies at age of four and is currently pursuing Bachelor's degrees in Piano Performance, Global Studies, and East Asian Studies at Lawrence University. An avid chamber musician, her recent performance highlights feature George Crumb's *Vox Balaenae* and Antonín Dvořák's Piano Quintet, Op. 81. Beyond her work as a performer, Qiaochuhan is engaged in academic research exploring the concept of Oriental fantasy in Puccini's *Madame Butterfly*.

Yimei Liang is a third-year undergraduate pianist at the Eastman School of Music, where she studies with Professor Marina Lomazov. She has garnered recognition at numerous competitions, earning First Prize for Best Schumann Performance and First Prize in the Interlochen Concerto Competition.
